

Thousands of digital photographs have been taken in schools over the past decade or so, but how many of them were taken by the children? Tablet technology now allows children instant access to a camera and to subsequent images that they can then instantly make part of their work. Simple, yet powerful apps enable you to manipulate images and to use them in a wide variety of creative ways and for pupils to demonstrate their knowledge and understanding of a topic. If you're going on an educational visit, make sure that you take the tablets so that pupils can take photographs and instantly create content. We live in a world of instant images through Facebook etc and we've got to make education that way too. It is pointless children going on a visit and then a week later looking on Google for an image!!! Apps can be used to edit images, to create collages and to add text, labels and special effects.

Taking video footage and making movies is now also easy on tablet devices and we should allow children the opportunity to regularly utilise these skills. A wide range of apps make the movie making experience a whole lot more creative than simply point, record and play! Apps enable the video footage to reflect the period in history, to look like a news report, have text and special effects added and be made to look like professionally created movies. Video features such as 'time lapse' also offer powerful features for use within education.

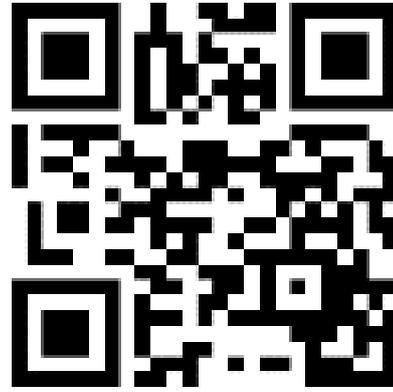

Animation is a great way to bring any topic or character to life and can be accessed by children of all ages. Simple apps allow images to be given a voice and for animated characters to be included in known locations. As pupils' skills in animation develop, they can progress to creating stop-motion animations, using plasticine and other movable objects.

Green screen is now very easy and accessible for pupils of all ages. There is no need for expensive software or purpose built studios. Combine with other apps for some great 'app smashing' results. Pop-up green screens or ones on a metal frame are available for under £50 (Amazon). A green sheet or green backing paper will work equally well though. Consider having a green screen display board, green door, wall or green blinds in your classroom. The painted inside of a pizza or cereal box is also great. Combine with Lego, or Playmobil characters etc for some great results. Cut out laminated characters on the end of green drinking straws also works great and a simple bit of green thread can help achieve some great flying results. If you want a human to fly drape a green sheet over a table and then get the child to lie upon it!
